were 7.7 times more likely than men to sustain multiple blows TBIs related to violence. These types of injuries may put them at higher risk for neurodegenerative disease in the future. Kristi's research also found that women with a history of TBIs related to violence had higher rates of physical health problems and longer lifetime histories of incarceration than women who had a history of TBIs, but not TBIs related to violence. This information can help clinicians working with these women direct specialized treatment and services to address these vulnerabilities, which can help individual outcomes and reduce systemic cost burdens. She is presenting a brief summary of this research in poster form at the International Brain Injury Association's 12th World Congress on Brain Injury on March 31st. She defended the project on March 17th and will be submitting a manuscript of the complete study findings to the Journal of Interpersonal Violence shortly following her successful defense!
